Budadee Annual General Meeting 9th Sept. 2025 Wangka Maya • South Hedland



Seed Collection

Commercial Seed Collection Training

The latest ranger trip was a great success with 11 rangers participating. Laura from Yarnin Seeds met the team out at Tharra to provide a 2-day training workshop on commercial seed collection and processing methods. Along with ranger traditional knowledge this will set Budadee up for commercial seed collecting in the future.

The Budadee Aboriginal Corporation has recently signed a 3-year lease agreement on 84 Anderson Street in Port Hedland which will be the location of the Native Seed Facility. With the help of Terra Rosa, a planning consultant from ALTUS has been appointed to get planning approval for the Anderson Street property first and foremost.

Once the seed facility is up and running, it can be used as a Budadee Ranger Hub for storage of not only the seeds, but vehicles and equipment.

There is a lot of work to go still before we can move in, with planning approvals required before we can purchase and install buildings and shipping containers to form the base of the infrastructure at the site. Rangers and their family members can access the site to help maintain the site and any machinery that we can keep on the property. There can also be opportunities for all to get involved with fixing the up place, installing signs and perhaps even painting murals on the shipping containers.

PJAC On-Country trip 6-9th October 2025

On the 6th of October, many Palyku families attended a 4-day on-country trip through many significant places. Some flew from places like Perth, and some drove in from places like Port Hedland, Broome etc.

This then helped them re-connect, understand and hear language. Meet our elders and bring the next generations onto country. Knowledge holders like Fred Stream and many of our Budadee Rangers shared stories and information to the mob about food, animals, colonial history of the homesteads etc. A lot of this history was spoken about at visited places like Bonney Downs and Corunna Downs. The most positive thing about this trip brought knowledge and memories to the older people that attended, and to share and teach the next generations who could be our next knowledge holders and care-takers of our land and waterways, animals and plants. Knowledge is power.


